A student obtained Grade 'F' in any paper shall be considered failed in that paper and shall be required to reappear in the examination of the paper when held next with the regular students of the semester concerned. A student shall be allowed only two consecutive additional chances to clear the paper in which she/he has failed. However, the maximum period allowed to complete the entire M.A./M.Sc./M.Com., programme shall be restricted to four consecutive academic years only.

It shall not be compulsory to obtain the minimum pass grade in continuing evaluation.

Rules for Post Publication Reassessment of Answer Script

Candidates may apply for post-publication reassessment of all the papers (theoretical) only in each semester on payment of a fee of Rs. 75/- for each half course/paper and Rs. 150/- for each full paper within 10 (ten) days from the date of dispatch of marksheets from the office of the Controller of Examinations.
