1. Academic and Career Advantages

NCC can be taken as a minor subject or interdisciplinary course, enriching cadet's academic profile. Cadets with 'C' Certificates enjoy special entry schemes into the Indian Armed Forces, such as direct entry into the Officers Training Academy (OTA) of the Indian Army without being asked to appear for the UPSC CDS examination. Additionally, vacancies at the Indian Military

Academy (IMA) are also reserved for NCC 'C' Certificate holder and bonus marks are given in various competitive examinations which boost the chances of selection of the cadet.

2. Enhanced Employability

NCC certificate holders receive preference in recruitment across Armed Forces, paramilitary Forces, SSC, and UPSC. Renowned organizations like Reliance Industrial Security also give special consideration to cadets, enhancing job prospects in both public and private sectors.

3. Attractive Allowances

Cadets receive a Tiffin Allowance during training sessions and a Uniform Allowance of ₹3800/at present which may be enhanced in future through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) directly to the bank account of the cadet, covering the cost of their NCC uniforms.

4. Scholarship Opportunities

Scholarships are offered by the Cadet Welfare Society help deserving meritorious cadets so that they can continue their education and training without financial burden.

5. Recognition and Awards

Outstanding cadets are honored with prestigious accolades including the Governor's Medal, Defence and Chief Minister's Commendation Cards, and the DG NCC Commendation Card – all of which enhance cadet's resume and set the cadet apart in competitive fields.

RECENT ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE COY

The COY has achieved great distinction through awards like the receipt of Governor's Medal, Defence Minister's Medal, and DG NCC Commendation Card by the cadets of the COY.
